Re: Spring 2018 Ten-day Census - Official Enrollment Data (Initial Release)

Enclosed (attached) are official spring enrollment data as of the ten-day census. These tables and additional data will be published on the Office of Institutional Research (OIR) website: http://www.oir.uic.edu/ along with interactive tables of enrollments, and retention/graduation rate dashboards.

Below are a few highlights from the spring enrollment data.

Enrollment Trends

- ➤ UIC's total spring 2018 enrollment is 28,725, up by 5.9% (+1,588 students) from the spring 2017 enrollment of 27,137.
- ➤ Historically, our total spring enrollment is lower than total fall enrollment. The difference in spring 2018 enrollments (28,725) as compared to fall 2017 (30,539) is -5.9% (-1,814). The fall to spring percentage difference has ranged from -4.5% to -6.8% over the last eight years and the enrollment count difference has ranged from -1,260 to -1,983. There are many student flow factors influencing this pattern of lower spring enrollments compared to fall. Some of those are captured in the trends by student level and student type. Additional factors include students' graduating and student attrition/retention.
- ➤ A total of 1,902 students graduated in December 2017: 1,148 were undergraduates and 754 were graduate or professional students. This number of total graduates is similar to December 2016 (1,892).
- There are 371 UIC global students enrolled in spring 2018, and there are 36 UIC global students among the 71 new first-time freshmen this spring. This population will continue to grow and we will analyze trends going forward.
- Compared to last spring by student level, undergraduate enrollments are up 8.5% (+1,391), graduate enrollments are down -1.5% (-111), professional school enrollments are up 2.1% (+65) and continuing education enrollments are up 58.1% (+243). This overall pattern in spring enrollments is similar to the comparison of fall 2017 to fall 2016 enrollments we saw this fall. Overall enrollment growth is driven by significant growth in undergraduate

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enrollments with a smaller increase in professional school enrollments and a decrease in graduate enrollments.

Compared to last spring by student type, continuing student enrollments are up 5.4% (+1,372), first-time graduate enrollments are down -3.5% (-14), first-time professional school enrollments are down -10.9% (-48), new first-time freshmen enrollments are up 163.0% (+44), new non-degree graduate enrollments are up 22.4% (+38), new non-degree undergraduate enrollments are up 138.8% (+68), and new transfer-in undergraduates are up 18.4% (+128).

Undergraduate Retention

➤ Of the 4,014 new first-time full-time freshmen in fall 2017 a total of 3,641 are enrolled this spring, for a retention rate of 90.7%. In comparison, the retention rate from fall 2016 to spring 2017 was 90.3% and the retention rate from fall 2015 to spring 2016 was 91.1%.
