Re: UIC's Graduation and Retention Rates

Graduation Rates

UIC's overall six-year graduation rate for the fall 2014 entering cohort is 63.5%, an improvement of three percentage points when compared to the previous entering cohort (fall 2013). It is the highest six-year graduation rate ever at UIC. Six-year graduation rates improved across all racial and ethnic groups and for both male and female undergraduates. Differences by race/ethnic groups remain, with lower rates for African American and Hispanic undergraduates. Highlights of the newly released rates include:

- The fall 2014 overall entering cohort six-year graduation rate for full-time, first-time freshmen is 63.5%. This is up from 60.5% for the fall 2013 cohort and is our highest rate within the last 5 cohorts, and our highest rate on record.
- The fall 2015 overall entering cohort five-year graduation rate for full-time, first-time freshmen is 57.3%. This is down from 59.3% for the fall 2014 cohort. This suggests that their six-year graduation rate (that will be reported next fall) will be lower than the 63.5% for the fall 2014 cohort, likely by about two percentage points.
- The fall 2016 overall entering cohort four-year graduation rate for full-time, first-time freshmen is 39.6%. This is up from 36.5% for the fall 2015 cohort and 36.7% for the fall 2014 cohort and it is our highest rate on record. This suggests that their six-year graduation rate (that will be reported in two years) will be higher than the 63.5% for the fall 2014 cohort, likely by about three percentage points. If that pattern holds, the fall 2016 entering cohort would set a new high for six-year graduation rates at above 66% and above the UIC target of 65%. The four-year graduation rate has been steadily increasing for the last five cohorts, with a total increase of more than nine percentage points.
- The fall 2014 entering cohort six-year graduation rate improved overall for Hispanic undergraduates to 57.5%, up from 55.8% for the fall 2013 cohort the highest rate on record.
- The fall 2014 entering cohort six-year graduation rate for African American undergraduates is 54.2%, up 8% from 46.2% for the fall 2013 cohort and it is the highest rate on record.
- African American undergraduates are much more likely to drop-out with poor academic standing (28.9% vs. 19.6% overall). The same is true of Hispanic undergraduates but to a lesser degree (25.8%). Despite the gap, the percent of African American undergraduates that

Ph: 312-996-3254 Fax: 312-996-2481 Web: oir.uic.edu drop-out with poor academic standing has been improving steadily for recent cohorts from 52.0% for the fall 2005 entering cohort and down 6.8% from the fall 2013 entering cohort.

- Our six-year graduation rate for the fall 2014 cohort of transfers is 79.2%, up from 76.9% for the fall 2013 transfer cohort, and it is the highest rate on record.
- For the fall 2014 full-time, first-time entering cohort, undergraduates entering the College of Applied Health Sciences have the highest six-year graduation rate (70.9%), followed by the College of Engineering (70.1%).

One-Year Retention Rates

UIC's one-year retention rate for the fall 2019 entering cohort is 82.2%, up 3% from the retention rate for the fall 2018 entering cohort (79.2%). The fall 2019 retention rate is the highest rate on record, with the second highest being 81.7% for the fall 2009 cohort.

- The retention rate increased for African American undergraduates (76.2% for the fall 2019 cohort as compared to 70.8% for the fall 2018 cohort). This is lower than the recent high of 81.7% for the fall 2014 entering cohort.
- For the fall 2019 entering cohort, College of Engineering entering students have the highest retention rate, both for retention within their college (80.5%) and overall retention at UIC (87.7%).
